This Summer Ocala Civic Theatre will present ONSTAGE the Disney mega-hit

"HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL"

Since its premiere January 20, 2006 on Disney Channel, *HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL* (the movie) has been televised 13 times and was seen by over 37 million unduplicated total viewers. Its premiere telecast alone set household ratings records for Disney Channel and the movie has since set ratings records in Australia and Southeast Asia. By the end of the year, it will be televised in 100 countries worldwide. The soundtrack is the #1 top-selling album of the year (to date), has certified triple Platinum (over 2.7 million sold) and delivered six Gold certified singles since its January 10 debut. The "High School Musical" release on DVD sold over 2.3 million copies since its release on May 23 and is the best-selling TV movie on DVD of all time. A junior novel based on the movie soared to #1 on the New York Times bestseller list (children's paperbacks) and a folio of sheet music for guitar, piano and vocals is a top-seller.

ABOUT THE SHOW: On the front steps of East High, it's the first day after winter break. The Jocks, Brainiacs, Thespians and Skater Dudes find their cliques, recount their vacations, and look forward to the new year. In Ms. Darbus's homeroom, basketball team captain Troy discovers that Gabriella, a girl he met singing karaoke on his ski trip, has just enrolled at East High. Between classes, Gabriella and Troy look at the audition sign-up for the school musical, but the drama diva Sharpay discourages them. At basketball practice, Troy tries to shake his desire to sing at the urging of his best friend Chad. Taylor, the science club president, discovers Gabriella's intelligence and encourages her to join the upcoming science decathlon. Hopeful Thespians strut their stuff for Ms. Darbus, but they're no match for Sharpay and her twin brother Ryan. Troy and Gabriella arrive too late to audition, but Kelsi, the show's composer, plays the song her way and encourages them to sing. Ms. Darbus overhears and gives them a callback. News spreads fast. Sharpay is furious. The Jocks and Brainiacs devise a plan to trick Troy and Gabriella into forgetting about the musical and committing to their respective competitions. Thinking each one has betrayed the other, Gabriella and Troy are crushed. Against Ryan's advice, Sharpay convinces Ms. Darbus to move the callbacks to conflict with the science decathlon and championship game. Chad and Taylor put their heads together to make things right again. When Taylor's laptop shuts down the electricity, Troy and Gabriella rush to the theater and they sing their way into the lead roles.

ABOUT THE AUDITIONS AND PERFORMANCES: **AUDITIONS** are open to students age 14 to 21. (Students must have reached their 14th birthday by the date of auditions.) Auditions will be held May 21 and 22 at 7:00 p.m. at Ocala Civic Theatre. Students wishing to audition should prepare 16 bars of an uptempo song and ballad. Bring your sheet music or a tape or CD. An accompanist will be provided. No a cappella auditions, please. Dress comfortably and be prepared to move. **REHEARSALS** will begin Monday, June 4, at 6:00 p.m. – and will run Monday through Friday from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. Some Saturday rehearsals may be needed as performance dates approach. This is not a class. This is a follow-up to last summer's successful teen production of *Godspell*. It will follow the same procedures and requirements as a main stage production. **PERFORMANCE DATES** are July 13, 14, 19, 20 and 21 at 7:00 p.m. and July 14, 15, 21 and 22 at 2:00 p.m.
