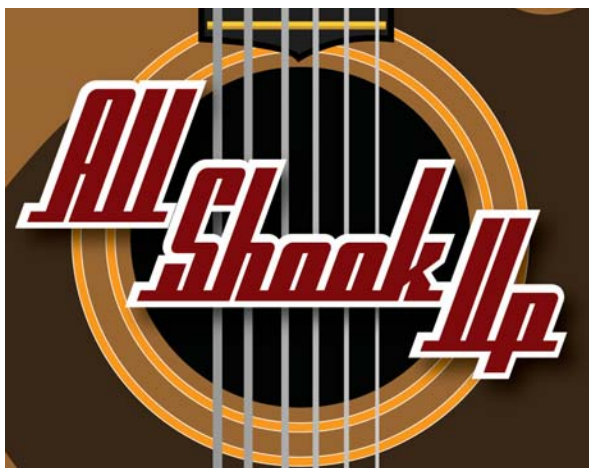

ABOUT THE SHOW

All Shook Up is a jukebox musical with a book by Joe DiPietro (the author of this year's Special Presentations Series production of *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*). The story is based on the plot of William Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night*. It is a musical comedy built around a number of songs made famous by Elvis Presley. It's not a biographical revue. It takes place in 1955, somewhere in middle America, where one girl's dream and a surprise visit from a mysterious leather-jacketed, guitar-playing stranger helps a small town to discover the magic of romance and the power of rock and roll. *All Shook Up* has played to rave reviews across the country and is currently one of the most widely-produced modern musicals. The show features such classic Elvis tunes as "All Shook Up", "Burnin' Love", "Heartbreak Hotel", "Love Me Tender", "Don't Be Cruel", "Jailhouse Rock", "Teddy Bear", "C'mon Everybody", "A Little Less Conversation", "It's Now or Never" and "Blue Suede Shoes". And many more!

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Allen McCoy is a member of Actors Equity Association and has worked professionally as an actor for over thirty years. In recent years, he has directed productions for the Timestep Players, Oak Park Village Players, The Children's Theatre of Florida, DeBary Children's Theatre, Orlando Repertory Theatre, Sands Theater Center and Circle School in Orlando. His most recent Ocala Civic Theatre productions include *Macabaret V*; *The Beloved Dearly*; *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*; *The Orphan Train* and *The Bully Show!* Prior to joining the staff at Ocala Civic Theatre as the Director of Education, Allen was an adjunct professor at the University of Central Florida where he taught Theatre History, Dramatic Literature, Movement and Acting.

ABOUT THE AUDITION

Be prepared with either a 16 bar up-tempo or ballad that is show appropriate. Bring the sheet music, or a tape or CD. An accompanist will be provided or you can bring your own. No a cappella auditions, please. Come prepared to dance. There may also be readings from the script. Copies of the script will be available for perusal at the Theatre during regular box office hours, Monday through Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. The script may also be checked out with a refundable deposit of \$10.00, but call ahead to make sure there is one in stock. If you are unable to attend one of the scheduled auditions, call Allen McCoy at (352) 236-2851 to inquire about a separate audition. ROLES AVAILABLE

Twenty-five to thirty performers will be cast. The following roles are available. All interested performers age 14 through college age are welcome and invited to audition. Experience is helpful, but not necessary. All roles sing, but need not be soloists.

- **NATALIE:** A young woman and an excellent mechanic. She is much more at home in greasy overalls than a dress.
- **CHAD:** A great lookin', motorcyclin', guitar-playin', leather-jacketed rebel.
- **JIM HALLER:** Natalie's widowed father. Middle-aged and messy, he still longs for his wife.
- **SYLVIA:** The no-nonsense owner of Sylvia's Honky-Tonk.
- **LORRAINE:** Sylvia's teenage daughter. Pretty, smart and a total romantic.
- **DENNIS:** An awkward young man. He aspires to be a dentist.
- **MISS SANDRA:** The beautiful, intellectual caretaker of the town's museum.
- **MAYOR MATILDA HYDE:** The town's very conservative Mayor.
- **DEAN HYDE:** Matilda's teenage son. He has spent his youth in military school and has never disobeyed his mother.
- **SHERIFF EARL:** The law in town and a man of not many words. He loyally follows the Mayor wherever she goes.
- **MALE and FEMALE ENSEMBLE:** Plays an assortment of townspeople.
