Return with us now to the New York City of 1954 ... a time of beefy Buicks and a hit parade dominated by Kitty Kallen ... when Fifth Avenue was a two-way street and "everything had chlorophyll in it" ... and it was the heart of the Golden Age of live television, as exemplified by "The King Kaiser Comedy Cavalcade", a popular weekly ninety-minute NBC variety show.

Off-camera, Kaiser is a tyrant and a bully with a whole team of writers laboring frantically to produce the lines and sketches that assure his reign as "America's caliph of comedy". Until the red light in the studio flashes on and long-legged beauties dance

on to inform the home audience that Maxford House is the evening's proud sponsor, the pressure to come up with the goods is intense.

When Alan Swann, a famed-but-faded and frequently sloshed actor, is signed up for a guest spot on the popular show, young Benjy Stone, a bright-eyed freshman gag writer is assigned to keep the washed-up, but still madly swashbuckling movie star reasonably sober through a week

of rehearsals. Easier said than done. Public fountains are swum in, blondes are chased and mayhem erupts in the televi-

sion studio. There's even a trek out to the Brooklyn home of Benjy's mother, Belle, where half the neighborhood crams itself into the living room to get a glimpse of Swann. Meanwhile, Benjy tries to sweep the frosty but fetching K.C. off her feet, a zany "Three Muskateers" scene is brainstormed, and Swann is troubled by the news that his longestranged daughter is in town.

Based on the movie of the same name, *My Favorite Year* is one of those bright, breezy and entertaining musicals that's a lot of fun to see. The score ranges from uptempo numbers to ballads -

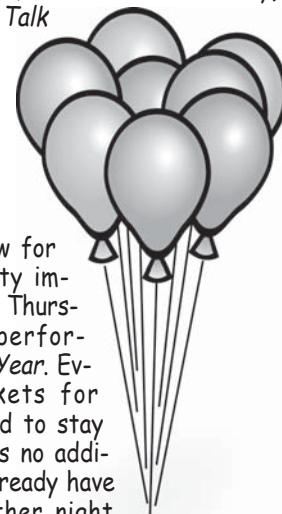

Dygert** and costume design by **Bridget Bartlett**. **Clark Dougherty** serves as production stage manager.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello! Something old ... something new. We just finished our 56th Season on June 30 and I am delighted to tell you that it was one of our best years ever. *Cats* set a new attendance record. Our year-round education program surpassed the 1,000-student mark for one year. The total attendance for the year surpassed the old record set in 1999-2000 and set a new record at 58,865. And, lastly, this marks the tenth year in a row that we have served over 50,000 people. Our ten-year total now is over half a million people! Our recorded attendance since moving into our current facility in 1988 is 833,678. In addition, we finished the season in the black, converted to a computerized box office system, and have a newly-redesigned website.

At our Annual Meeting on July 18, we presented several reports for review by the Board of Directors and membership. We also said goodbye to several Board members who retired and welcomed their replacements. Having completed their terms, Garry Adel, Dennis Hagin, Michael Cooper and Holly Rubin were recognized and thanked for their service. Beth Cordova, Andy Copeland, Doug Kirkland, John LaPaille and Tim Roberson were each elected to serve two-year terms. Also that evening, the new slate of officers was elected including Philip Leppert as President, Bill Duell as Vice President, Mary Jo Cavalier as Treasurer, and Fred Mullen as Secretary. If you would like copies of any of the reports, please contact me and I will be happy to forward the information to you.

Part of the fund-raising campaign to build our current facility included "selling" the seats in the auditorium. To recognize each donor, a plaque was placed on the arm of their seat. The seats have been well-used and, lately, the donor plaques were beginning to look worn, so this summer we had all the plaques replaced. If you were one of the original donors, we wanted you to know that we continue to appreciate your generosity by having the plaques re-engraved. I hope you like the results. There are five seats that were never sold. If you would like to join the original group of donors and buy one of the last five seats, give me a call. Each seat sells for \$500.00. Take a look when you attend *My Favorite Year*.

Under the heading of "something new" ... Our new computerized box office is up and running. Thank you to everyone for your patience, as we learned the system and tried new things. The final step in the conversion will take place on August 28, when the online portion of the system goes live. On that date, tickets will be available online for our season opener *My Favorite Year*. You will then have three ways to purchase tickets - by telephone, in person and online. Season ticket holders should still call or come by the box office to allow us to serve you better. Also anyone wishing to use a discount offer, such as the School Check/Coupons for Education, student tickets, complimentary tickets or gift certificates should contact the box office directly. However, if you are interested in purchasing a full-price adult ticket to any of our shows, log on to our website (www.ocalacivictheatre.com) and follow the instructions. If you have questions, call us and we will walk you through the process. We are very interested in your comments about our new website and the online ticketing system. Please let us know what you think. Thanks are due to PC House Productions for the terrific job they did redesigning our website, especially Tony Vindett and Chip Morris.

Also under the "something new" category ... We have added a new Saturday matinee to all three MainStage musicals. Because of the demand for matinee tickets, we now have three Saturday matinees and four Sunday matinees. And don't forget to buy season tickets. You get all the shows at a great low price. Call us for details.

ED NOTES

Wow! How fast has this summer flown by? And what a summer it has been. To give you an idea of how busy this past summer was, here are a few numbers: 24 workshops and performance classes were offered, 365 students were enrolled in theatre classes, 5 shows were produced with 30 live performances, attendance at summer productions was 3,000-plus, and 20 student volunteers worked 1,100-plus community service volunteer hours.

Yes, it's been so busy, it's almost a welcome relief for some students to be heading back to school ... almost. But the start of school does not mean things will be slowing down around here. The new-look, full-color Fall Class Brochure is out and it is filled with classes and activities for the coming months.

Heading the list of fall offerings are our popular performance and production classes. Once again, we will present *Macabaret (IV)*, a comical, revue-style show for our talented students in grades 8 through 12. In December, *Aladdin* will appear on the main stage, featuring a cast of 30-plus students in grades 2 through 12.

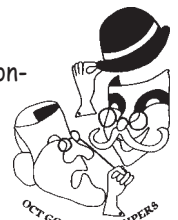
Weekly workshop classes will include music and creative drama classes for all ages, as well as writing and performance classes for our middle and high school students. We will also offer two very special Saturday morning workshops. The first (just in time for *Aladdin* auditions) is an audition technique workshop for young actors. The second is a hands-on stage combat workshop, focusing on hand-to-hand fight stunts, such as punches, kicks, slaps and falls. We are also very pleased to announce that we will once again offer Saturday morning workshops designed to help area Brownies and Junior Girl Scouts with their Let's Pretend and Theatre merit badges. And, finally, we will offer a home school course titled "Page To The Stage: The Art of Adaptation", which will focus on adapting narrative literature to script form for performance.

As we close out a successful summer and prepare for an "awesome Autumn" line-up, I would like to take care of a few very special thank you wishes. First, a big thanks and congratulations to 169 student performers who graced the stages at Ocala Civic Theatre this summer. In addition to the performers, I want to thank the 21 student crew members who played such important roles in the success of our summer productions of *Frumpled Fairy Tales*, *Alice In Wonderland*, *Wingin' It*, *Godspell* and *The Jungle Book*. Thanks to all of the students who took part in classes these past weeks ... I hope your summer was as much fun as mine. And thanks to the parents of our students who found time in their busy schedules to ferry their children back and forth to classes and rehearsals, and who have continued to support our growing program. And finally, a very special thank you and good-bye to one of our favorite instructors, Katie Warford. Katie has been a part of this Theatre since she was a child and, after directing her final show here this past summer, has relocated to Oregon with her new husband. Your students and your friends will miss but never forget you. Break a leg!
