The gala was the culmination of the Theatre's 2005-2006 Season. The evening began with cocktails, hors d'oeuvres and a silent auction, followed by dinner and the awards ceremony at which Harvey Awards were presented to recognize outstanding performances in the following categories:

- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a Special Presentations! Series Production: **Susan Moring** for *The Champagne Charlie Stakes*, and **Bruce Clayton** and **James May** for *A Toast To Broadway*
- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a MainStage Comedy or Drama: **Marsha Benningfield** and **Tom Whatley** for *Harvey*
- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a MainStage Musical: **Lani Cole** and **John Sherman** for *The Mikado*, and **Donny Posey** for *Cats*

Judges Special Ensemble Awards were presented to the cast of *Nunsense* and the cast of *Cats*.

The following "Wall Of Frames" technical awards were announced: Best Set: *The Mikado*, Best Costumes: *Cats*, Best Hair and Make-Up: *Cats*, Best Lighting: *Cats*, Best Sound: *Cats*, Best Stage Crew: *The Mikado*, Best Choreography and Dance Performance: *Cats*, Best Musical Performance: *The Mikado*.

Special recognition was given to several outstanding volunteers for the season. Presidential Awards were given to **Amelia Marsteller**, **Paulette Millhorn**, **Judi Lasaga**, **Marion Ross**, **Sharon Duell** and **Sarah Rzepecki**. The Outstanding Young Volunteer Award went to **Sarah Lemire**; **Joanne Faucette** received the Chuck Shannon Memorial Golden Trouper of the Year Award; and **Gregg Bleam** was named Marion Player of the Year. The Chris Ahern Memorial Award for outstanding service as a volunteer was presented to **Pat Klitenick**; the Mike Hewett Memorial Award for outstanding service on the Board of Directors went to **Bill Duell**; and **Bernie Stadick** received the Dick Conover Memorial Award for outstanding sustained service to the Theatre.

The awards program concluded with the announcement that *Nunsense* was selected by the judges as the Best Show of the Ocala Civic Theatre 2005-2006 MainStage Season.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello! I hope your summer is going well. Here at the Theatre, the air is filled with the sound of the pitter patter of little feet as the youth classes continue through the end of July. We hit an exciting milestone with our education program this year when, for the first time, we served over 1,000 students in one year! Our fiscal year ends on June 30, so we are still totaling the attendance at programs and performances, but I know we have already surpassed the 50,000 mark for the tenth year in a row. I'll be able to tell you the final totals next month, but knowing that over half a million people have been served by the Theatre in the last ten years is really cool.

I also wanted to tell you that the final attendance for *Cats* was 9,267 during its four-week run, surpassing the previous record by nearly a thousand. Pippin and Bullwinkle wanted me to pass along their thanks to everyone who donated cat and dog food. We collected 1,403 pounds of food and \$386.00 in cash, all of which was split evenly among The Humane Society, Feisty Acres, and Kindred Spirits Sanctuary. The Theatre cats enjoyed greeting patrons and thanking them before each performance, and were delighted with the Star-Banner article about them. I haven't heard what their next project will be, but you can bet they will think of something.

Our annual Harvey Awards celebration, named for Harvey Klein, was a fun affair attended by nearly 200 people on June 10. Please take a moment to check out the article in this newsletter about the event. We recognized several outstanding volunteers and introduced our college scholarship winners. We also recognized two businesses for their incredible support during the season - the Star-Banner and FOX 51. While we take time to thank the volunteers that night, they deserve our thanks the whole season long for all that they contribute to the Theatre. In fact, this year we have had 424 active volunteers. Together they donated over 57,000 hours since July 1, 2005. Isn't that incredible? Think how much the ticket prices would go up if we paid these volunteers just minimum wage. Well, let's see. Minimum wage is now \$6.15 an hour. Our costs would increase by \$354,480! Next time you see one of our volunteers, give them a hug and say thanks. Their willingness to volunteer their time and talent to the community is the reason we are able to offer such successful programs.

I wanted to give you an update on our plans to computerize our box office. This summer we have been making the transition from a manual system to the new computerized system. When you call or come into the Theatre, we will now be making your reservations on the system. We are also completely overhauling our website. The new site should be up by the time you receive this newsletter. Check us out at www.ocalacivictheatre.com and let us know what you think. It is the same address we have been using, but if you have us listed in your "Favorites" file, we suggest that you delete the listing in "Favorites" and reinstall us with the new site. Coming soon, hopefully by August 14, you will also be able to purchase tickets online for our shows. If you have season tickets, you will still need to call or come into the Theatre box office so that we can serve you better. There are often tickets available to season ticket holders that will not show up online. Also there will be a service charge for buying tickets online, but there is no service charge for buying tickets through our box office by phone or in person. We will continue to update you as these changes go into effect, but if you have any questions, just call or e-mail us and we will be happy to explain.

VIP: VERY IMPORTANT PERSON

Each year, Ocala Civic Theatre chooses a student to receive recognition as the Outstanding Young Person of the Year. This month, we would like to profile **Sarah Lemire**, who won the award at this year's Harvey Awards Banquet.

Sarah was bitten by the theatre bug at a 4H Theatre Camp during the summer of 2002 in her native New Hampshire. She decided after the camp that theatre was her love and that she wanted to become a director.
