Ocala Civic Theatre volunteers and patrons gathered at Ocala Civic Theatre on Saturday, June 9, for the Thirty-Fifth Annual Awards Ceremony and Eighteenth Annual Harvey Awards. The gala was the culmination of the Theatre's 2006-2007 Season. The evening began with cocktails, hors d'oeuvres and a silent auction, followed by dinner and the awards ceremony at which Harvey Awards were presented to recognize outstanding performances in the following categories:

- Outstanding Cameo Performance in a MainStage Musical: **Ken Noble** for *42nd Street*, **Bill Duell** for *My Favorite Year* and **Tyler Schank** for *Seussical*.
- Outstanding Performance in a Supporting Role in a MainStage Comedy or Drama: **Susan Moring** for *I Hate Hamlet* and **Michael O'Brien** for *The Battle Of Shallowford*
- Outstanding Performance in a Supporting Role in a MainStage Musical: **Martie McLean** for *My Favorite Year* and **Abbey McBee** for *Seussical*
- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a Special Presentations! Series Production: **John LaPaille** for *The Foursome*, **Patrick Stanley** and **Jessica Mongerio** for *A Day In Hollywood, A Night On Broadway*, and **Fred Mullen** for *The Drawer Boy*
- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a MainStage Comedy or Drama: **Chip Morris** for *The Battle Of Shallowford* and **Randall Moring** for *I Hate Hamlet*
- Outstanding Performance in a Leading Role in a MainStage Musical: **Sarah Rzepecki**, **Dani Moreno-Fuentes** and **Thomas Mothershed** for *Seussical*

Judges Special Ensemble Awards were presented to the Tap Dance Ensemble of *42nd Street*.

The following "Wall Of Frames" technical awards were announced: Best Set: *I Hate Hamlet*, Best Costumes: *42nd Street*, Best Hair and Make-Up: *42nd Street*, Best Lighting: *42nd Street*, Best Sound: *42nd Street*, Best Stage Crew: *42nd Street*, Best Choreography and Dance Performance: *42nd Street*, Best Musical Performance: *Seussical*.

Special recognition was given to several outstanding volunteers for the season. A Presidential Award was given to **Henry Ince**. The Outstanding Young Volunteer Award went to **Jesse Mixson**; **Susan Pattie** received the Chuck Shannon Memorial Golden Troupier of the Year Award; and **Bill and Rose Lawrence** were named Marion Players of the Year. The Chris Ahern Memorial Award for outstanding service as a volunteer was presented to **Bruce Clayton**; the Mike Hewett Memorial Award for outstanding service on the Board of Directors went to **Paulette Millhorn**; and **Ken and Karen Hilton** received the Dick Conover Memorial Award for outstanding sustained service to Ocala Civic Theatre.

The awards program concluded with the announcement that *Seussical* was selected by the judges as the Best Show of the Ocala Civic Theatre 2006-2007 MainStage Season.

for the school musical, but the drama diva Sharpay discourages them. At basketball practice, Troy tries to shake his desire to sing at the urging of his best friend Chad. Taylor, the science club president, discovers Gabriella's intelligence and encourages her to join the upcoming science decathlon.

The next day, hopeful Thespians strut their stuff for Ms. Darbus, but they're no match for Sharpay and her twin brother Ryan. Troy and Gabriella arrive too late to audition, but Kelsi, the show's composer, plays the song her way and encourages them to sing. Ms. Darbus overhears and gives them a callback. News spreads fast, Sharpay is furious, and some students try to break out of their cliques during lunch. The Jocks and Brainiacs devise a plan to trick Troy and Gabriella into forgetting about the musical and committing to their respective competitions. Sharpay convinces Ms. Darbus to move the callbacks to conflict with the science decathlon and championship game. But Chad and Taylor put their heads together to make things right again.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Hello! As we wrap up the season, pay all the bills and reflect on the 57th Season, I am moved by the support the Theatre receives from the community. It all starts with the volunteers. This year we had 435 volunteers who donated a total of 60,081 hours! Isn't that amazing? Yes, we have nine full-time staff and a few part-timers, but it is the volunteers, starting with the board of directors, who have made the biggest contribution to our success this season. Actors, backstage crew members, the folks who build the beautiful sets and costumes, the ushers and concessions folks, most of the box office crew, the volunteers who help with mailings, the student interns in the Education Department, and many more talented and dedicated individuals work throughout the year to make sure that our community has the best live theatre we can produce. Let's say we paid just the minimum wage (\$5.15) for all those hours (and minimum wage doesn't touch what their talent deserves!) Our budget would increase by \$309,417.00. You can imagine how much ticket prices would increase if we were not the beneficiaries of such generous individuals. We also are supported by businesses, like Ashley Furniture, that lend us furniture and props throughout the season; by Wayne's Cleaners which gives us a discount on all our drycleaning; by the corporate sponsors like On Top Of The World that donated money and services to help underwrite the costs of our programs; by individuals like Ralph Pressley and Dagny & Don Harris who donated money to make sure that our educational outreach programs are open to all children; by the State of Florida's Division of Cultural Affairs and the several foundations like Bank of America, Target, The Richard B. Salsbury Foundation, and the Marion Cultural Alliance, which through competitive grant programs fund a variety of our activities. And that's not all. One of the most important support groups we have is our season ticket holders. This year we had 4,500 season subscribers to the MainStage season. Some of those subscribers have supported us for twenty or more years, some as many as thirty. Your trust in us, and what we offer the community, is greatly appreciated. Thank you, each and every one, for your support. If you are interested in a full report on the Theatre's activities during the 2006-2007 season, you are welcome to attend our annual meeting on Tuesday, July 17, at 7:00 p.m. at the Theatre. There is lots of good news to report, so I hope you will join us.

We have two new partners supporting us for next season - Pioneer Garden Club and Greater Ocala Woman's Club. These two groups have taken on the Theatre as a beautification project. They started by planting flowers, weeding, pruning, and feeding the shrubs and trees. They are putting their considerable gardening expertise to work, plus donating flowers, fertilizer and LOTS of volunteer hours, making the exterior patios look more welcoming to patrons. They have already organized several work-days and plan more for the future. The chairmen for the project are Joann Welty from Pioneer Garden Club and Rosalie Laudando from Greater Ocala Woman's Club. They tell me that this is a long commitment and it is a work in progress. Thank you for your generous support!

Lastly, this month I wanted to encourage you to buy season tickets, if you haven't already done so. We've got a great season lined up and I don't want you to miss a single show. See you at the Theatre!

VIP: VERY SPECIAL PEOPLE THE SUMMER INTERNS

Each summer our Education Department takes center stage. The kids are out of school, so we find the Theatre filled with the happy sound of young voices. In order to create the best atmosphere for learning, we have recruited student interns to assist with all the classes. Interns must fill out an application and be interviewed by the Director of Education. They must be enrolled in high school or college. And they will be volunteering. Now, wait a minute. It's summer. They are out of school. They could be lying on the beach. Or hanging out at the movies. But these are special students. They have chosen to give up part of their summer to volunteer at the Theatre and work with younger students to encourage them in the performing arts.

What will interns do this summer? Just about everything. They assist the teachers in classroom work. Demonstrate the games. Work with students learning their lines. Escort students to and from the restrooms and to get water. Supervise students during lunch breaks. Help with props and sets. Check in students each morning and wait with them until parents pick them up after class. The interns are cheerful and encouraging to the students. They are the eyes in the back of our heads. They help us keep the kids safe and make sure they have the best experience at the Theatre.

This year we have 18 student interns. Collectively, they will volunteer 1,760 hours over the two-month period. Most of the students are accruing hours for community service which will be included in their applications for college.
